Off-Center Errors

Here are records of recent sales of off-center mint errors on eBay:

1. All coins were listed on eBay and closed from July 1, 2005 to September 30, 2005.
2. All lots had buyers. If the coins actually changed hands is unknown.
3. A picture accompanied each lot or it was not recognized.
4. Mislabeled items were ignored.
5. Some lots may have changed hands more than once.

6. "D" next to the date symbolizes that the coin had damage or was scratched.
7. "C" next to the date symbolizes that the coin was cleaned.
8. "B" next to the date symbolizes that the coin had damage and was cleaned.
9. If the date or mint mark was missing or partially visible, parentheses were used.
10. Postage/handling/insurance fees were ignored.
11. Major auctions were not listed.

\$80 Nickel Sells for \$264,500 in Heritage Auction

From September 29, 2005 Heritage Press Release:

DALLAS, TEXAS: Heritage Numismatic Auctions, Inc., (HNAI) sold a 1916 Nickel with the date doubled on the obverse, PCGS graded MS64, for \$264,500 in its most recent Signature Auction, held September 21-24, 2005 as the Official Auctioneer of the Long Beach Coin Expo. The entire auction realized about \$23.5 million, with the nickel being the most expensive single lot.

“A regular example of this date might sell for about two dollars, while one in a comparable grade might sell for about \$80,” said Jim Halperin, Co-Chairman of HNAI, “but this stunning error example, with the date double-struck, brought \$264,500, a world record price for a Buffalo nickel at auction.”

“There are very few examples of this error coin in existence,” said Halperin, “possibly no more than a couple hundred pieces, with only a few known to be equal to

this example and none finer. In fact, the error state remained unknown for more than four decades after the production of the coin. This is one of the rarest and most popular 20th century error coins, and one that is very attractive to the advanced nickel collector.”



Just Discovered & Certified by NGC: A Two Headed Off-Metal Mint Error

There are approximately thirty genuine two-headed or two-tailed coins that have been authenticated by ANACS, PCGS or NGC. There are only four known "Two Tailed" U.S. coins: three Quarters and one Dime. One of the Quarters recently sold for \$80,000.

I have handled most of the world coins that were struck with either two obverse or two reverse dies. Two of these are Canadian Copper Cents that were struck with two reverse dies and authenticated by PCGS. I purchased these in a Canadian Mint Error Collection and they have since been featured in a front page Coin World article.

The coin featured here is a Great Britain ½ Pence. It was struck with 2 obverse dies. Instead of being struck in bronze, it is on a Copper Nickel blank planchet. To date, this is the only known "Two Headed" or "Two Tailed" mint error that is also an off-metal.

It is an exciting discovery since this a unique combination. This occurred when mismatched dies were selected to strike ½ Pence coins and a wrong planchet inadvertently remained in the collar. Unique.



1812 Cap Bust Half No Edge Lettering

This famous Bust Half mint error was from the Logan Collection auctioned during the 2003 ANA in Baltimore. It is one of only six known plain edge Bust Half Dollars in the entire series. It appears to be broadstruck since it is on a Type 1 blank planchet.

This fascinating bust half dollar completely lacks edge lettering and as such is extremely rare, with only a handful of specimens known for the entire lettered edge bust half dollar series (1794 to 1836). These few “plain edge” piece happened because they did not receive the first step in the minting process: the feeding of the blank through the edge-lettering machine that applied the words “FIFTY CENTS OR HALF A DOLLAR” to the blank’s edge.

This lettering machine, known as a Castaing machine for its inventor, the Frenchman Jean Castaing, consisted of 2 flat bar dies, one fixed in place and the other moving. Using a hand crank, the blank was rotated between the bar dies as the lettering was pressed into the coin. The distance between the bar dies was slightly less than the diameter of the half dollar blank, with the result that the rims of the blank planchet were raised and its diameter became smaller as it rotated through the machine.

Because this coin didn’t pass through the Castaing machine when it was a blank, its diameter is slightly larger than normal. The distance from the stars to the edge on the obverse is greater than

usual, and similarly the distance from the tops of the letters to the edge on the reverse is greater than usual.

In addition, the edges of this coin have a much different look. All around the obverse, the outer edge is rounded as it makes the 90 degree transition into the edge; all around the reverse, the outer edge is sharp as it makes the transition. This is because the blank was punched out of a piece of silver strip, with the result that the side of the blank that the punch pushed on had squared (sharp) edges, and the side which popped out first got the round edges. Of course these features would have been obliterated if this piece had passed through the Castaing machine.

Among the few known plain edge bust half dollars, this piece shows off its unusual features to an exceptional degree, and its high grade magnifies its desirability. It is a wonderful and rare error coin!





1996 Turkish Gold 25 Kurush Full Reverse Brockage

Brockages on world gold coins are rare. This is a first strike brockage.



1875 3¢ Nickel Struck Fragment

Major mint errors in the 3¢ Nickel series are very rare. This 1875 3¢ Nickel was struck on a thin piece of scrap which was laying on top of a 3¢ Nickel blank. It is a spectacular type error and very well known.



1859 Pattern Longacre's Liberty Head Uniface Die Trial

This is one of three known uniface die trials by Longacre to create the 1859 U.S. Half Dollar pattern. It is struck in white metal or lead and is considered a pattern dollar because of the size and relief of the portrait. It is listed in United States Pattern Coins Eighth Edition in appendix A, page 310, J-A1859-7.



1969-S Proof Roosevelt Dime Struck Clad Layer

All major proof errors are rare. This is the first struck clad layer on any U.S. denomination struck in proof. It is still in the original 1969-S proof set holder issued by the U.S. Mint in San Francisco.



1965 Jefferson Nickel Special Mint Set Struck 5% Off-Center

Major mint errors from Special Mint Sets are very rare. This SMS Jefferson Nickel was struck 5% off-center and is in gem condition.



1873 Seated Dime w/Arrows Struck 12% Off-Center

This is a spectacular major mint error. All major mint errors in the Seated Dime series are rare. To find a major off-center that is also dated 1873 with Arrows is exciting. It is almost 15% off-center and is virtually mint state.



J425/P497 Struck Over an 1840-O Quarter

NEWLY DISCOVERED OVERDATE QUARTER MAY SHED LIGHT ON “IN GOD WE TRUST” TRANSITIONAL PATTERN QUESTION

“What year was it really struck?” For the vast majority of coins this is an irrelevant and perhaps silly question. Just look at the date dummy!! Of course there are famous exceptions. For example the dollars dated 1804 were made decades after 1804, and only painful research has revealed the likely actual years of their manufacture.

The discovery of an 1865 pattern quarter struck over an 1840-O quarter may shed light on a series of pattern coins where the actual date of striking has long been a question. This is the series of Civil War era coins related to the adoption of the motto “In God We Trust”. As for regular issue coins, the motto first appeared on the 1864 Two Cent piece, and then was adopted on the regular Quarter, Half Dollar, Dollar, Half Eagle, Eagle, and Double Eagle denominations in 1866. However pattern coins with “In God We Trust” actually were struck on 1863 dated Two Cent pieces, 1863, 1864, and 1865 dated Quarter, Half, and Dollar denominations, and on 1865 dated Half Eagles, Eagles, and Double Eagles in copper. These coins are called “Transitionals” as they are made/dated in years before they were adopted for regular coinage.

It was long assumed that all of these “In God We Trust” patterns were truly struck in the same years they were dated, but as research evolved, it was generally concluded that the 1863 and 1864 dated pieces were probably struck in later years, perhaps in 1868 or 1869 by mint employees for sale to collectors. Die characteristics and die rust on the reverses of the 1863 and 1864 Quarters tend to reinforce this conclusion. However it was still widely believed that those dated 1865 actually were from 1865. In fact the 1949 Red Book even included the 1865 “In God We Trust” Half Dollar as a regular issue.

Then in 1977 one of these 1865 transitionals, an

1865 “In God We Trust” Dollar (listed as Judd no. 434 in one of the standard pattern references, *United States Pattern, Experimental and Trial Pieces* by J. Hewitt Judd) appeared in the Fairfield Collection sale. The cataloguer, Bowers & Ruddy, noted that the coin was over struck on an 1866 dollar! The coin was bought by Harry Bass Jr. and today resides in the Bass museum at the ANA in Colorado Springs. The eminent numismatic scholar Walter Breen summarized the impact of this discovery in his *Complete Encyclopedia of U.S. and Colonial Coins* published in 1988:

“For generations the silver and gold coins (of 1865) were accepted as true transitional issues . . . but in recent years their status has been flung into doubt because of a single silver dollar dated 1865 with motto, over struck on another dollar dated 1866.”

Breen concluded that all of the 1865 “In God We Trust” pattern denominations were likely struck in 1866 or later, largely it seems based on the evidence of this coin.

Fast forward to the late 1990’s when closer inspection of the coin revealed that it was not struck over an 1866 dollar but rather over an 1853! So Breen’s evidence has been nullified and the question of whether the 1865 coins are “true transitionals” or later date productions remains open.

All of this background highlights the significance of the discovery of another of the 1865 pattern series over struck on an earlier coin. In this case it is a Quarter (Judd 425) struck on an 1840-O Quarter. The coin, housed in a PCGS Proof 65 holder, was acquired by the author as an upgrade to another Judd 425 in his collection. Upon close examination it was evident that an 1840-O quarter had been used as the planchet for the pattern.



It is clear that the person minting the coin placed the older quarter in the press so as to have it in alignment with the pattern die. (This was also true of the Fairfield/Bass dollar discussed above.) However the placement of the quarter was off by a few degrees and the alignment is therefore slightly rotated. As a result a ghostly image of the 1840-O coin can be seen beneath the 1865 overstrike. The digit 1 of the 1840 appears well in front of the 1 of the 1865 date. The digit 8 of the original coin date is also in front of and partially under the overstrike 1. The 5 is under the 8 and the 0 beneath the 6 of the overstrike. Other elements of the 1840-O quarter design are also visible including the stars and central figure of Liberty, all rotated to the same degree. The reverse shows the same effect with the mintmark "O" and features of the eagle clearly visible. Of course the "In God We Trust" motto does not appear in the underlying image, as it was a "no motto" coin.



While the coin certainly does not prove the 1865 transitionals were definitely struck in 1865, it importantly does not disprove it either. Obviously if it were over an 1866 or later dated coin, the case for a later striking would be proven. Other sources of evidence, including a letter dated December 15, 1865 from Mint Director James Pollock to Secretary of the Treasury, Hugh McCulloch, point to the probability that these coins were made in 1865. In his letter Pollock references enclosure of pattern coins: "...I now forward to you specimens in copper, of the Double Eagle, Eagle, and Half Eagle (gold coins) and the Dollar, Half dollar, and Quarter Dollar (silver coins) with the motto "In God We Trust" on the reverse of each coin, for your approval or otherwise as required by law." Pollock does not specifically state that the coins are dated 1865 (they could in theory be dated 1866 if the 1866 obverse dies had been prepared by mid December of 1865). But it is clear they were definitely made in 1865. It is reasonable to believe they were also so dated.

There is also the possibility that some were struck in 1865 and others later. The most recent rarity estimates for the coin in silver (Judd 425) are about a dozen known. Estimates in copper (Judd 426) are also for about a dozen pieces. Of the 7 or 8 pieces in both silver and copper that the author has been able to see, all appear to be from the same dies. They also show no signs of die rust or significant die polishing. So if there are "earlier" and "later" strikings they may be indistinguishable from one another.

An obvious mystery is why someone would use an old quarter as a planchet for this striking. It might be presumed that a mint employee "unofficially" used his own quarter and kept the pattern as a souvenir or

sold it into the numismatic marketplace. This is a likely explanation. But we should also think about the letter from Pollock to the Treasury Secretary. He indicates that the patterns he forwarded were in copper and that upon the Secretary's approval he would "at once" provide patterns in gold and silver as normal for the denominations. We might imagine that as the copper specimens were being produced no silver planchets were at hand and the mint employees/officials were anxious to see how they would appear in silver and on the spot used coins from their pockets. Since a Dollar and now a Quarter have been found, the question comes up as to whether one of the pattern "In God We Trust" Half Dollars of 1865 might also exist as an

overstrike. Imagine overstrikes discovered of all three silver denominations! Pattern collectors please check any 1865 "In God We Trust" Judd 429's that you might have!!

At the distance of nearly a century and a half from the events, we can study the coins and the archives, speculate, and at times reach conclusions. But part of the fascination of pattern coins is contained in the ongoing mysteries about the times of and reasons for their being made. Walter Breen likewise said about the 1865 "In God We Trust" transitional patterns: "Whatever their actual time and occasion of manufacture, these coins will remain prized as great rarities".

1921 Morgan Dollar with an Adjustment Strike and a Misaligned Obverse Die

Editor's Note: The following description is from the Heritage Galleries 2005 June Long Beach Signature Auction

NGC has not ventured a grade for this rare and desirable mint error. Luster glimmers from the borders of both sides, and in terms of remaining luster, this piece merits an AU designation. Because it is an adjustment strike, the strike is very soft along the right side margins, and the peripheries of the design are also weak, as made. The obverse die is also misaligned several degrees toward 12 o'clock, which affects only the denticles in that area. A lightly toned cream-gray final year Morgan Dollar that has several moderate marks on the cheek and neck. Significant Morgan Dollar errors are rarely encountered, and the error combination of a misaligned die and an adjustment strike may be unique to the present piece.

Extremely Rare 1937 Great Britain Half Pence Edward VIII Uniface Die Trial



This die trial striking is of great numismatic importance and rarity. Edward VIII (1894-1972) abdicated the English throne in 1936. This reverse die trial portraying a ship was struck in a bronze composition and weighs 5.66 grams. The obverse is uniface since only the reverse die was used. It is in gem proof condition. This die trial was struck in the Royal Mint by T.H. Paget, who also designed the official portrait for the coins of Edward VIII struck at the Royal Mint in London.

Upon the death of his father, King George V, in January 1936, Edward was proclaimed King Edward VIII, King of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. Edward VIII abdicated the throne on December 11, 1936 in order to marry an American, Mrs. Wallis Simpson. His

brother, the Duke of York, was next in line and became King George VI. Edward VIII received the title Duke of Windsor and married Mrs. Simpson in June 1937.

An Edward VIII 3 Pence struck with both the obverse and reverse dies is photographed and listed in Krause under patterns with a value of \$45,000. Several other denominations of Edward VIII are also photographed and listed including a Shilling at \$37,000, a Sovereign at \$120,000 and several others listed as rare or have no price listed.

The story of Edward VIII is one of the most fascinating in World Numismatics since coins were struck bearing his portrait but were not released.

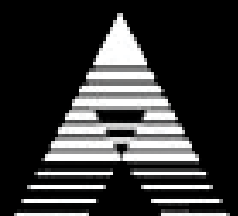

Mint Error News Price Guide

This price guide is brought to you by Mint Error News. It has been compiled by many of the top major mint error dealers.

This price guide is a guide. Prices fluctuate due to the date, grade, eye appeal and how dramatic the striking error is. Rarity is also a factor. The price is sometimes based on the rarity and grade of the type of coin as well as how rare the error is. The price can also vary depending on whether two collectors are bidding for the same rare major mint error. When purchasing a mint error, it is important to use multiple resources to determine value, as there are many mint errors that do not fit into one category.

Proof Errors



Proof coins are struck by technicians who hand feed the blanks into special presses. They are produced, examined, and packaged using extreme quality control. It is very unusual to find major proof errors. A few broadstrikes, off-centers, double strikes in collars and off-metals have been known to be found in sealed proof sets. Proof errors are aggressively sought after by many error collectors.

A very small group of Proof errors recently came from a collection that was auctioned by the State of California. The U.S. Secret Service inspected and released this collection to the State of California determining that it was legal to own. The State of California then auctioned the collection and it has been dispersed since the sale.

Broadstrikes



A broadstruck error occurs when a coin is struck without the collar to form the rim and edge that is part of the shape of the coin. Coins can be broadstruck on either type one or type two planchets. When a coin is broadstruck the blank being fed into the collar will spread and distort outward as it is being struck because the collar isn't in the correct position to retain it.

Partial Collars



Partial collar strikes occur when there is a malfunction of the striking press. This causes the collar to be in an incorrect position. The lower die (usually the reverse die) is recessed in the collar. This allows the coin which is going to be struck to have a formed rim. After a coin is struck the lower die raises upwards, pushing the struck coin out of the collar and ejecting it. If a blank entering the collar is not properly seated, it will only have partial reeding as it is struck. The edge of this coin will have a partial reeding and a partial blank surface area. Recently, the Mint has installed new machinery where either die can be installed in either position.

Uniface Strikes



Uniface coins occur when there have been two blank planchets in the press at the same time. The other blank will obstruct the die on either the obverse or reverse side, which will prevent it from having that design on the coin. There are many different variations involving uniface errors. In addition to having a 100% blank obverse or reverse, a coin can be struck off-center, with a blank planchet in the collar which will obstruct one side of the off-center. There are also mated pairs which have a combination of multiple errors which can include a side which is uniface. Finally, there are uniface strikes due to a die cap which adhered to the die, forming itself in the shape of a die and striking blank planchets.

Bonded Coins



Bonded coins occur when the feeder system, which supplies blank planchets to the coin press, malfunctions and jams. When this occurs, a struck coin is not properly ejected and another planchet is fed into the collar and is struck. This struck coin will land on top of the previously unejected strike. These coins will then crush and bond together. This may occur many times as more coins bond.

Coins Struck on Feeder Finger Tips



After a recent tour of the U.S. Mint at Philadelphia, it was discovered that the minting process had changed to some degree. One of the changes was that “feeder fingers” were used during the striking of all denominations of U.S. coins. Prior to this tour, U.S. coins that were struck on feeder finger tips were authenticated and described as being struck on aluminum scrap. Coins from all modern denominations have been discovered that were struck on the tips of these feeder fingers.

Struck Fragments



The blanking press takes the coils of metal strips and punches blanks out of it, ejecting the webbing at the other end. The webbing is cut into small scrap pieces to be melted and recycled. Occasionally a scrap piece will be mixed with the blank planchets and struck by the dies. Struck fragments are rare in the larger denominations. These can be uniface or die struck both sides and are very rare on type coins.

Mated Pairs



Mated pairs involve two individual coins with different errors that were struck together at the same time. Mated pair error combinations can be found in most error types and come in many shapes and sizes. Mated pairs can be overlapped when one of the coins is struck off-center on top of another coin. Another type involves a brockage where a struck coin was perfectly centered on a blank and restruck. Some mated pairs involve a die cap where the cap and brockage coin are discovered together, but this is a scarce find.

The rarest mated pair type involves two die caps (obverse and reverse) where both dies were capped at the same time and both die caps are mated. This last type is extremely rare and there are only a few known examples of mated pairs involving an

obverse die cap and reverse die cap. There are several of these mated pairs known on Kennedy Halves including two dated 1976, which is the Bicentennial year. One of the most spectacular mated pairs involve two Barber Dimes, an obverse die cap mated to a reverse die cap and are unique.

Mated pairs can also involve an off-metal where a smaller blank planchet or smaller struck coin was struck on top of a larger coin. This type is extremely rare. The most spectacular pair known is a double struck Franklin Half which was mated to a Lincoln Cent. The Lincoln Cent blank was on top of the obverse of the struck Franklin Half. This pair was then struck together. It is unique.

Transitional Errors



A transitional error occurs when a coin is struck on a planchet from a previous year with different metal composition. The most famous transitional is a 1943 copper cent struck on a 1942 copper blank. 1943 cents were struck in steel because of the copper shortage during World War II. Other famous transitionals include 1965 coinage struck in silver instead of clad.

There are also transitionals struck on blanks for the next year. An example is 1964 coinage in clad instead of silver. Most recently, transitionals were discovered involving the SBA and Sacagawea Dollars of 1999 and 2000. There are eight known 1999 SBA Dollars struck on the brass planchet for the 2000 Sacagawea Dollar, and four known 2000 Sacagawea Dollars struck on a clad planchet for the 1999 SBA Dollar.

U.S. Gold Errors



Major mint errors on U.S. Gold coins are the most prized category of all mint errors. Gold errors are very rare and a few have traded in the \$75,000 to \$100,000 range. Even a broadstruck U.S. Gold coin can easily sell for \$15,000 to \$30,000 compared to a broadstruck Cent, Nickel, Dime or Quarter which all sell for well under \$10. Many serious collectors of Gold Errors have to wait patiently for months and sometimes even years to acquire that one special piece for their collection.

The prices listed here are for common dates in AU-Unc. Better dates and errors that are in gem condition are worth considerably more.

Indents



An indent error occurs when two blanks are fed inadvertently into the same collar, with one blank partly overlaying on top of the other. When the hammer die strikes this combination, the upper blank will be forced into the lower blank, creating a depression which is shaped similar to the upper blank. A scarce type of indent occurs when a blank intended for one denomination lands on top of a blank from a different denomination.

A capped die is caused when a struck coin sticks to the upper hammer die. Once the coin is struck to the die face, the reverse of the struck coin becomes the new die face. When the next blank is fed into the collar and the strike occurs, the reverse design of the adhered struck coin impresses itself into the new blank. This struck coin is a brockage strike. The coin that adhered to the upper die is known as a die cap. This process repeats itself as more coins are struck by the cap. The greater the number of strikes, the higher the cap metal will be pushed around the upper die shaft. Eventually, the cap brakes away from the die in the shape of a thimble.

Die Adjustment Strikes



Die adjustment strikes are also known as die trials. This error occurs when a coin is struck from the press with very little pressure. When the press is being set up and adjusted, extremely weak strikes occur as the strike pressure reaches its optimum level. These die trials are destroyed after being struck and are rarely found in circulation.

Double Denominations



One of the most expensive, popular, and desired types of errors are the double denominations. This error happens when a coin is struck on a previously struck coin of a smaller denomination. Examples are a cent on a struck dime, and a nickel on a struck cent. The most dramatic are those with considerable design visible from the original strike. There are a few known double denominations with different dates.

Brockages



A brockage error can only occur when there are two coins involved. One of the coins involved will always be a struck coin which has not ejected properly. That struck coin will find its way back between the dies and will be struck next to a blank planchet which was fed into the collar. The image of that first struck coin will be impressed into that side of the blank planchet. The result will be a second coin which has images of the first coin impressed into it. Those images will be pressed into the coin and the image will be in reverse. This incuse sunken image is known as a brockage.

Double & Multiple Strikes



When a blank planchet is struck by the dies, the normal procedure is for the feeders to eject the struck coin out of the collar and into a chute. If there is a malfunction and the struck coin isn't ejected, it may receive a second or third strike by the dies. A multiple struck coin can happen in many ways and have many combinations of errors.

Off-Center Strikes



Off-center coins are one of the most common and best known types of errors. This happens when a blank which is supposed to be fed into the press, lands in the collar improperly. When this occurs only part of the blank is between the upper and lower dies. When the dies strike the blank, only that part will be struck with a design.

Off-Metals



Off-metal and wrong planchet errors occur when a correctly made blank from one denomination is accidentally fed into a press for another denomination. Examples are a nickel struck on a cent planchet and a cent struck on a dime planchet. The coin struck on an incorrect blank will weigh exactly what the denomination of that blank would have been. An even more dramatic wrong planchet error is a coin struck on a previously struck coin of a different metal.

Struck on a 3.7g Clad Planchet

This unique Ike Dollar off-metal was just discovered. There is mystique and excitement surrounding this recently discovered Ike Dollar struck on clad planchet that weighs 3.7 grams. It is the exact size of a U.S. Quarter blank but it is the thickness of a U.S. Dime blank. This weight and diameter does not match any foreign coins struck at any of the U.S. Mints during the time frame when Ike Dollars were minted.

It could be struck on any of the following:

- An improperly manufactured U.S. Quarter blank
- A Quarter blank punched to Dime thickness
- A blank planchet intended for a metal or token
- An unidentifiable blank planchet intended for a foreign coin which was never struck at a U.S. Mint.

A Study of World Mis-Struck Coins

by Bill Snyder - worlderrors.com

Editor's Note: This is a first in a series of charts to be published in Mint Error News Magazine which were compiled by Bill Snyder of worlderrors.com. He undertook a study to painstakingly research and compile a list of known errors from major world countries. The chart below covers English striking errors from 1600 to 1995.

Bill states that "this study will determine which types of mis-strikes were common or rare, by country and time period. The study was limited to major striking errors such as double strikes, off-centers, brockages, etc."

Unique 1965 Kennedy Half Dollar Discovery

This discovery mint error is unique and it is still a mystery why it was struck. After 40 years it is the only known striking of a Kennedy Half Dollar with a composition of 25% Silver and 75% Copper.

As everyone knows, the composition of U.S. silver coins changed from 1964 to 1965. The 1964 Kennedy Half Dollar was struck on a 90% Silver and 10% Copper planchet with a weight of 12.5 grams. In 1965, it was changed to a composition of 40% Silver and 60% Copper with a weight of 11.5 grams.

This unique off-metal is on a full-size planchet with a weight of 7.62 grams and has a composition of 25% Silver and 75% Copper.

It does not match any known world coin struck at any of the U.S. Mints during the time period of the transition from 90% Silver coinage

to 40% Silver coinage. Nor does it match the weight or composition of the inner core of the planchet strip used to strike the silver coinage of 1964 or the silver clad coinage from 1965 through 1970.

It is unknown why this piece was struck and why a planchet was used with this weight and silver composition.



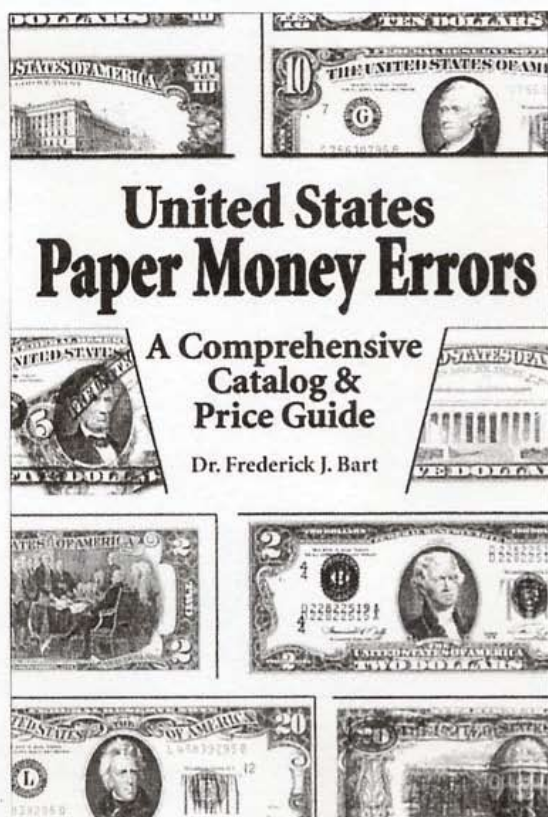

Frequently Asked Questions

What are proof errors?



Proof coins are struck by technicians who hand feed the blanks into special presses. They are produced, examined, and packaged using extreme quality control. It is very unusual to find major proof errors. A few broadstrikes, off-centers, double strikes in collars and off-metals have been known to be found in sealed proof sets. Proof errors are aggressively sought after by many error collectors.

A very small group of Proof errors recently came from a collection that was auctioned by the State of California. The U.S. Secret Service inspected and released this collection to the State of California determining that it was legal to own. The State of California then auctioned the collection and it has been dispersed since the sale.

Frequently Asked Questions

What are uniface strikes?



Uniface coins occur when there have been two blank planchets in the press at the same time. The other blank will obstruct the die on either the obverse or reverse side, which will prevent it from having that design on the coin. There are many different variations involving uniface errors. In addition to having a 100% blank obverse or reverse, a coin can be struck off-center, with a blank planchet in the collar which will obstruct one side of the off-center. There are also mated pairs which have a combination of multiple errors which can include a side which is uniface. Finally, there are uniface strikes due to a die cap which adhered to the die, forming itself in the shape of a die and striking blank planchets.
