Here are records of recent sales of off-center mint errors on eBay:

1. All coins were listed on eBay and closed from January 1, 2008 to March 31, 2008.
2. All lots had buyers. If the coins actually changed hands is unknown.
3. A picture accompanied each lot or it was not recognized.
4. Mislabelled items were ignored.
5. Some lots may have changed hands more than once.
6. "D" next to the date symbolizes that the coin had damage or was scratched.
7. "C" next to the date symbolizes that the coin was cleaned.
8. "B" next to the date symbolizes that the coin had damage and was cleaned.
9. If the date or mint mark was missing or partially visible, parentheses were used.
10. Postage/handling/insurance fees were ignored.
11. Major auctions were not listed.

There have only been a few major mint errors discovered in 2007 other than the missing edge lettering errors on the Presidential Dollar series.

Elliptical clips (coins struck on elliptical planchets) have been found on almost every state quarter struck so far. This proof Utah State Quarter is unique and spectacular for several reasons. It is the only State Quarter known that is struck on an elliptical planchet in proof and also claims the distinction of being the only known U.S. proof coin on any denomination that was struck on an elliptical planchet.

Here is an exciting 2007 Denver Dime multi-struck on Aluminum scrap (the tip of the feeder finger). It weighs 12 grains and is the size of a U.S. Half Dollar.

# Presidential SI Error Coins: James Monroe 

## By Duve Canire (IGC \& INS)

This article is part of our series on Presidential Error Coins, and focuses on the 2008 James Monroe Dollar.

There is no doubting that a great number of collectors continue to search through rolls of Presidential Dollars looking for error coins. Take, for example, this evidence: the coins were released on February 14,2008 , and NGC has already received a handful of submissions of error coins. While the earliest issues of the series were found without edge lettering, the more recent issues do not exhibit this error in abundance (if

Instead, NGC is seeing different sorts of errors, which are as a general rule much more scarce. For example, NGC has certified a few James Monroe \$1 edge lettered planchets. These are coin blanks (technically planchets), prepped for minting, that were never struck but passed through the edge lettering machine only. Depending on the settings of the edge lettering machine, this can result in a few possible outcomes, the most desirable of which is a "blank coin" showing full edge lettering.

If they're not struck, how do we know that these coins are James Monroe dollars? Simple. The date 2008 appears as part of the edge lettering, and these coins were released early in the year. The next coin in the series that will be dated 2008 is the John Quincy Adams, and that coin is scheduled for release on May 15. Until that coin is released, NGC can designate 2008 edge lettered dollar planchets as (JAMES MONROE). After the release of the John Quincy Adams dollars, edge lettered planchets dated 2008 will not be attributed by President at NGC. Thus, only the first coin issued each year is eligible for such attribution.

Edge lettered planchets essentially come in two varieties, fully edge lettered and partially edge lettered. Edge lettering is weak on all edge lettered planchets because they have not been struck to their full diameter (as constrained by the collar). After upsetting, the planchets are fractionally smaller in diameter than their final struck dimensions. Because of their smaller size, the edge lettering is applied under less pressure and can be weak. This may also cause the edge lettering to be only partial. Alternatively, a planchet can get hung-up in the edge lettering machine, and only partial lettering may be imparted. This type of partial edge lettering has been seen on a number of struck Presidential \$1 Coins.

## Presidential $\$ 1$ Error Coins: James Monroe

In addition to the errors previously described, NGC has also certified a Monroe $\$ 1$ Coin missing clad layer.

## Presidential \$1 Error Coins: James Monroe

Presidential dollars are composed of the same threepart clad layers as the Sacagawea dollars. Planchets missing an outer layer show one side in rich copper color, as the pure copper center of the coin is exposed. This bright red is a sharp contrast to the "golden" appearance on the other side of the coin, adding to the

drama of this error. Because coins missing a clad layer are thinner than normal planchets, they show weakness in the design especially along the edge of the coin.

# Dual Dated Double Denomination Errors 

## by Rich Schemmer (richerrors.com)

Many error collectors and dealers alike are unaware of the dual dated double denomination error. That is how very rare they are. There are approximately twenty examples known for all combined dates \& denominations, including any double denomination error with two different dates, such as a 1999 Cent struck over a struck 1998 Dime.

These can only logically happen at the end of one coining year and the beginning of another. A previously struck dime (1998) gets stuck in a hopper trap door and then the hopper is filled with planchets destined to be struck by the upcoming new year dies (1999). So it appears this rare combination of errors can only happen at the years end and if all the error circumstances are right!

There are only approximately twenty known for all dates \& denominations for dual dated specimens. Normal double denomination errors with the "same" date, number approximately 900-1200 known. That's a 45 to 60 to ONE " 1 " ratio.. Same date Double denominations currently costing from $\$ 800-\$ 1,100$.


You do the math! $60 \times \$ 1,000$. Hmmm! Sounds like today's prices of $\$ 6,000-10,000$ are pretty cheap. There are about 10-12 "U.S. Mule" errors known that cost $\$ 75,000-\$ 125,000$ each. Now consider the rarity of these dual dated double denomination errors. Lots of room for growth here, especially in the direction that the error market has been heading, UP!

# Washington Dollar Missing Edge Lettering Mint Errors

My numismatic adventure began on a Sunday evening in late February 2007. I happened across a Craigslist ad for a few odd coins for sale. I investigated further and then decided to call the number in the ad. As it turns out the seller was a bank teller and she had just purchased these strange coins at her branch on Friday morning. Through our conversation I was able to learn all about the just released Washington Presidential dollars with the new edge lettering, and much more importantly, the ones that were missing the edge incused lettering that she had been finding at work.

Even though I was a newbie to the coin collecting world, I had always been fascinated with error coins. I remember being in grade school 30 some odd years ago and picking up a book on coin collecting in the library. In this particular book they pointed out that if an error coin (they called them Fido's) made its way into circulation the value would usually be dramatically increased just by the fact that it had a mistake on it. From that point forward I had always dreamed of finding a rare error coin.

I was immediately set into action when I found out

there could be more of these coins available locally and I was up at the crack of dawn and in the car on my way to my local bank. Fortunately I had just sold a couple of used motorcycles the week before, so I had ample cash on hand to go out and purchase about 12,000 of these new coins and sort through them all for the errors.

I arrived at my bank's drive-thru a few minutes before they opened and I thought to myself, how am I going to get them to sell me all of these coins. When the teller came to the window I asked if they had the new dollar coins. She said they did and asked "how many would you like?" I said "I'll buy all that you will sell me." She gave me a sort of confused look then produced about 30 rolls of the new coins from under her counter. I promptly purchased them all and drove to the nearest parking spot to inspect them. I felt like Charlie opening his first Wonka bar in search of the golden ticket as I opened the first roll, carefully peeling back the paper, only to notice nothing but edge lettering on all of the coins in the roll. I opened 4 or 5 more and they were all the same. I had a feeling immediately that if a few of the rolls in a given branch didn't contain the errors then none of them would.

On to the next bank to try again, and similar to the first one, I received a bewildered look followed by the handing over numerous bags of rolled coins. Again I checked through them only to find all normal coins.

Then I went to an Amsouth bank next (now called Regions bank) and the lobby was now open so I walked up to the teller and asked to purchase the new coins. Unfortunately this banks policy on selling the new dollars was not as liberal as the previous ones. The teller only agreed to sell me 3 rolls, so I took them and returned to my car once again hoping to find the elusive error coins. As I opened the rolls the smooth edged coins in the roll stood out in stark comparison to the ones bearing the normal lettering, it was an incredible rush! I just paid $\$ 75$ for 3 rolls of 25 coins that contained at least 15 errors total. At this point in time they were selling for around $\$ 300$ - $\$ 400$ and I am thinking that I have thousands of dollars worth of coins in my hands and rightly so!

At this point I enlisted every person I had available to relieve this branch of its golden toned booty. My wife and some of my friends went into the branch and exited with 2 rolls each. At this point I am really getting excited about the prospect of this whole thing, but convincing the others to abandon work and join in on my soon to be 3 day saga was not in the cards. Another one of his wild schemes they no doubt thought. Could I blame them? My track record on investments and such was pretty lackluster up until this point. I however knew the significance of this find and would not be deterred, so off I went, blackberry in hand, mapping out every Amsouth location from St. Augustine to Jacksonville Florida.


Every branch was different, some would just sell all the coins they had without question, and others wouldn't sell me any due to the fact that I was not a banking customer. That soon changed as I opened a brand new Amsouth account at one particularly helpful branch.

The next stop I made was at the local grocery store. Now I am armed and delicious, and taking aim at troublesome tellers with cheesecakes, pies and cookies of all sorts! If they would only sell 2 rolls of Presidential Dollars to me, a loyal Amsouth customer, how many would they sell to a man with a cheesecake in one hand and a roll of hundreds in the other? The answer was in most cases, almost all or all of them! When the treats were ineffective I was still able to convince some concerned tellers to sell me there coins by trading out some of the rolls I had purchased earlier from locations not containing errors, so they would still have dollars to offer to their adoring public.

I set out for home that night after the last bank had closed and I noticed that my vehicle was actually leaning to the right from the weight of the coins on the passenger floorboard and seat! I arrived home and immediately set up a workstation at the dining room table and began the sorting process. The amount of errors per roll generally averaged $10 \%-15 \%$ in almost every roll. The odd roll would have only 1 or 2 errors and a few had as many as 7 or 8 .

After a long but exciting night of careful sorting I set back out early in search of more locations. I changed to a faster car too. This actually helped me out more than just being quicker around town, because I was able to revisit a few of the same drive thru's from the first day without being noticed.

The second day actually netted more than the first because I did not waste my time with the non error bearing banks. The third day consisted of me turning
in several thousand of the normal coins to my bank to get some much needed capital and resume hunting. They were quite confused about this action and I did not tell them much, just please and thank you. They understood a little better a month later when I started making large deposits and making frequent trips to the safety deposit boxes.

I was able to find a few pockets of coin here and there on the third day but for the most part they had been bought out. Some banks had a lot of loose dollar coins to offer that had been returned for some odd reason, but very few locations had whole unmolested rolls left.

# NGC Certifies 2008 Monroe Dollar Edge Lettered Planchet

NGC has just certified a 2008-P (James Monroe) Presidential Dollar blank planchet with the lettered edge. This is the second one known dated 2008. It was submitted to NGC by Garrett Reich. The other blank planchet dated 2008 with the lettered edge was reported by Coin World in their March 17th, 2008 edition. It was discovered by Ken Sigler, owner of Cinnaminson Rare Coins in New Jersey, who plans to have it certified by PCGS.

The edge is inscribed with the mottos, date and mintmark. The photos below are courtesy of Garrett Reich and show the edge lettering. He discovered this blank planchet in a box of James Monroe Presidential Dollars.

I suspect that only a few will be discovered that are dated 2008. Major mint errors in the Presidential Dollar series are very rare and are highly prized by collectors.

## 1798 Large Cent First Strike Brockage Sells For \$27,600

## Editor's Note: From the Heritage Galleries auction listing:

1798 1C Second Hair Style--First Strike Brockage Reverse--AU50 PCGS. Obverse die of S-165, 166, and 167. The Second Hair Style with a Large 8 in the date. Only one obverse die was created with the combination of these features. Sheldon nicknamed the obverse the "Whisker Variety" for a tiny die chip on the lower edge of the chin, visible on both the normal image and the brockage image of this piece. It is a spectacular piece with medium brown surfaces and extraordinary eye appeal.

Attempting to narrow the variety choices is a fine numismatic pursuit. Working backwards, S-167 always comes with an obverse die crack through the 8 in the date. The present example has no obverse die cracks, so S-167 is eliminated. There is no bulge behind the low curls, as it appears on State III of S-166. Faint clash marks at Liberty's throat are seen on States I and II of S-166, and States II and III of S-165, and those are the choices. We feel strongly that this example is S-165. EAC 40.

# Triple Struck 1891 \$5 NGC Proof 64 

From the Heritage Galleries Austion Listing: 1891 \$5-Triple Struck with Reverse Rotation--PR64 Ultra Cameo NGC. This rare proof half eagle was struck at least three times by the dies. Of course, all proof Liberty fives were multiple struck, to bring out complete definition. What makes the present piece an error is that the hammer (reverse) die was apparently loose, and rotated a couple of degrees between strikes. The anvil (obverse) was stationary. As a result, the obverse shows no evidence of a multiple strike, but the reverse has faint rotated impressions from the prior two strikes. These are most apparent above the eagle's right (facing) shoulder, and southwest of the eagle's beak. For the final strike, the dies were close to medal turn. The devices are fully frosted, and contrast greatly with the darkly mirrored fields. Hair-thin field imperfections near the date, star 10, and the neck curls are all that limit the grade. A mere 53 proofs were struck, and perhaps half that number have survived. The NGC and PCGS population data are undoubtedly inflated by resubmissions over the past 22 years. Census: 4 in 64 Ultra Cameo, 9 finer ( $1 / 08$ ).

## Broadstrikes



Abroadstruck error occurs when a coin is struck without the collar to form the rim and edge that is part of the shape of the coin. Coins can be broadstruck on either type one or type two planchets. When a coin is broadstruck the blank being fed into the collar will spread and distort outward as it is being struck because the collar isn't in the correct position to retain it.

## Partial Collars



Partial collar strikes occur when there is a malfunction of the striking press. This causes the collar to be in an incorrect position. The lower die (usually the reverse die) is recessed in the collar. This allows the coin which is going to be struck to have a formed rim. After a coin is struck the lower die raises upwards, pushing the struck coin out of the collar and ejecting it. If a blank entering the collar is not properly seated, it will only have partial reeding as it is struck. The edge of this coin will have a partial reeding and a partial blank surface area. Recently, the Mint has installed new machinery where either die can be installed in either position.

## Uniface Strikes



Uniface coins occur when there have been two blank planchets in the press at the same time. The other blank will obstruct the die on either the obverse or reverse side, which will prevent it from having that design on the coin. There are many different variations involving uniface errors. In addition to having a $100 \%$ blank obverse or reverse, a coin can be struck off-center, with a blank planchet in the collar which will obstruct one side of the off-center. There are also mated pairs which have a combination of multiple errors which can include a side which is uniface. Finally, there are uniface strikes due to a die cap which adhered to the die, forming itself in the shape of a die and striking blank planchets.

## Bonded Coins



Bonded coins occur when the feeder system, which supplies blank planchets to the coin press, malfunctions and jams. When this occurs, a struck coin is not properly ejected and another planchet is fed into the collar and is struck. This struck coin will land on top of the previously unejected strike. These coins will then crush and bond together. This may occur many times as more coins bond.

## Coins Struck on Feeder Finger Tips



After a recent tour of the U.S. Mint in Philadelphia, it was discovered that the minting process had changed to some degree. One of the changes was that "feeder fingers" were used during the striking of all denominations of U.S. coins. Prior to this tour, U.S. coins that were struck on feeder finger tips were authenticated and described as being struck on aluminum scrap. Coins from all modern denominations have been discovered that were struck on the tips of these feeder fingers.

## Struck Fragments



TThe blanking press takes the coils of metal strips and punches blanks out of it, ejecting the webbing at the other end. The webbing is cut into small scrap pieces to be melted and recycled. Occasionally a scrap piece will be mixed with the blank planchets and struck by the dies. Struck fragments are rare in the larger denominations. These can be uniface or die struck both sides and are very rare on type coins.

## Mated Pairs



Mated pairs involve two individual coins with different errors that were struck together at the same time. Mated pair error combinations can be found in most error types and come in many shapes and sizes. Mated pairs can be overlapped when one of the coins is struck off-center on top of another coin. Another type involves a brockage where a struck coin was perfectly centered on a blank and restruck. Some mated pairs involve a die cap where the cap and brockage coin are discovered together, but this is a scarce find.

The rarest mated pair type involves two die caps (obverse and reverse) where both dies were capped at the same time and both die caps are mated. This last type is extremely rare and there are only a few known examples of mated pairs involving an obverse die cap and reverse die cap. There are several of these mated pairs known on Kennedy Halves including two dated 1976, which is the Bicentennial year. One of the most spectacular mated pairs involve two Barber Dimes, an obverse die cap mated to a reverse die cap and are unique.

Mated pairs can also involve an off-metal where a smaller blank planchet or smaller struck coin was struck on top of a larger coin. This type is extremely rare. The most spectacular pair known is a double struck Franklin Half which was mated to a Lincoln Cent. The Lincoln Cent blank was on top of the obverse of the struck Franklin Half. This pair was then struck together. It is unique.

## Transitional Errors



Atransitional error occurs when a coin is struck on a planchet from a previous year with different metal composition. The most famous transitional is a 1943 copper cent struck on a 1942 copper blank. 1943 cents were struck in steel because of the copper shortage during World War II. Other famous transitionals include 1965 coinage struck in silver instead of clad.

There are also transitionals struck on blanks for the next year. An example is 1964 coinage in clad instead of silver. Most recently, transitionals were discovered involving the SBA and Sacagawea Dollars of 1999 and 2000. There are eight known 1999 SBA Dollars struck on the brass planchet for the 2000 Sacagawea Dollar, and four known 2000 Sacagawea Dollars struck on a clad planchet for the 1999 SBA Dollar.

## U.S. Gold Errors



Major mint errors on U.S. Gold coins are the most prized category of all mint errors. Gold errors are very rare and a few have traded in the $\$ 75,000$ to $\$ 100,000$ range. Even a broadstruck U.S. Gold coin can easily sell for $\$ 15,000$ to $\$ 30,000$ compared to a broadstruck Cent, Nickel, Dime or Quarter which all sell for well under $\$ 10$. Many serious collectors of Gold Errors have to wait patiently for months and sometimes even years to aquire that one special piece for their collection.

The prices listed here are for common dates in AU-Unc. Better dates and errors that are in gem condition are worth considerably more.

## Indents



An indent error occurs when two blanks are fed inadvertently into the same collar, with one blank partly overlaying on top of the other. When the hammer die strikes this combination, the upper blank will be forced into the lower blank, creating a depression which is shaped similar to the upper blank. A scarce type of indent occurs when a blank intended for one denomination lands on top of a blank from a different denomination.

Die caps are caused when a struck coin sticks to the upper hammer die. Once the coin is struck to the die face, the reverse of the struck coin becomes the new die face. When the next blank is fed into the collar and the strike occurs, the reverse design of the adheared struck coin impresses itself into the new blank. This struck coin is a brockage strike. The coin that adhered to the upper die is known as a die cap. This process repeats itself as more coins are struck by the cap. The greater the number of strikes, the higher the cap metal will be pushed around the upper die shaft. Eventually, the cap brakes away from the die in the shape of a thimble.

## Die Adjustment Strikes



Die adjustment strikes are also known as die trials. This error occurs when a coin is struck from the press with very little pressure. When the press is being set up and adjusted, extremely weak strikes occur as the strike pressure reaches its optimum level. These die trials are destroyed after being struck and are rarely found in circulation.

## Double Denominations



One of the most expensive, popular, and desired types of errors are the double denominations. This error happens when a coin is struck on a previously struck coin of a smaller denomination. Examples are a cent on a struck dime, and a nickel on a struck cent. The most dramatic are those with considerable design visible from the original strike. There are a few known double denominations with different dates.

## Brockages



Abrockage error can only occur when there are two coins involved. One of the coins involved will always be a struck coin which has not ejected properly. That struck coin will find its way back between the dies and will be struck next to a blank planchet which was fed into the collar. The image of that first struck coin will be impressed into that side of the blank planchet. The result will be a second coin which has images of the first coin impressed into it. Those images will be pressed into the coin and the image will be in reverse. This incuse sunken image is known as a brockage.

## Off-Center Strikes



Off-center coins are one of the most common and best known types of errors. This happens when a blank which is supposed to be fed into the press, lands in the collar improperly. When this occurs only part of the blank is between the upper and lower dies. When the dies strike the blank, only that part will be struck with a design.

## Off-Metals



Off-metal and wrong planchet errors occur when a correctly made blank from one denomination is accidentally fed into a press for another denomination. Examples are a nickel struck on a cent planchet and a cent struck on a dime planchet. The coin struck on an incorrect blank will weigh exactly what the denomination of that blank would have been. An even more dramatic wrong planchet error is a coin struck on a previously struck coin of a different metal.

## Counterbrockages




#### Abstract

Acounterbrockage error involves a cap die and a previously struck coin. When a cap die strikes a previously struck coin, the obverse design from that struck coin will be impressed into the cap. The result will be a design where the cap face will be an incuse brockage. When a new blank is struck by this cap die with an incuse brockage image, the obverse will have a raised and spread image from that incuse design of the cap. This brockage impression is known as a counterbrockage.

## Fold-Over Strikes



Afold-over coin is one of the most dramatic types of errors. It occurs when the blank is standing vertically between the dies. During the strike, the force is so great that it bends and folds the blank. These fold-overs can be on-center or off-center, and come in many different shapes. There are a few fold-overs with multiple errors, either with an additional strike or fold-over. Denominations above quarters are very scarce.

## Martha Washington Test Pieces



TThere is one set of a Dime, Quarter and Half struck by Martha Washington dies that are permanently housed in the Smithsonian Institute, embedded in blocks of lucite. According to United States Pattern and Related Issues, by Andrew W. Pollock III, "the only trial pieces purported to have survived metallurgical testing in 1965 were the Dime, Quarter Dollar, and Half Dollar equivalent strikes in copper-nickel clad over copper."

Mike Byers' discovery of the Martha Washington Test Piece on a copper-zinc Cent planchet struck $10 \%$ off-center with a uniface reverse was a front page Coin World article on August 7th, 2000. In a response to the Martha Washington Test Piece that he discovered, the Mint announced that "the dies are available to the Mint's metal and blank vendors for testing."
